

Dam Commissioned

Daystar University Company Chairman Dr. Macmillan Kiiru led the Daystar Company, Council, management board, faculty, staff and students in commissioning of the construction of a 160,000m³ capacity dam at the Athi River Campus on Thursday 6th April 2017.

The ground breaking ceremony for the construction of the dam was preceded by a Chapel service. Preaching from the book of John, Council Member Pastor Muriithi Wanjau pointed out the importance of water and its refreshing quality and how the physical thirst we experience as human beings, points to a deeper and inner thirst for the Living Water, Jesus Christ. He drew parallel of how Jacob's well served many generations to the time of Jesus and how the Daystar dam will transform the landscape and lives of Daystar University and the local community.

The Council Chairman Prof. George Krhoda said that, "The dam is at the center of the development of the University and I am grateful to the many friends of Daystar who through their generous contributions have fundraised Ksh.74 Million." He asked that the Daystar community to pray for the project as efforts to raise the remaining funds for the dam continue.

Dr. Kiiru broke ground and prayed for the project in the presence of an enthusiastic community ranging from Council, Daystar Company, Management Board, faculty, students, Daystar University Parent Associations (DUPA) and Daystar University Alumni Association representatives (DUAA), officially marking the commencement of the construction of the dam.

The dam which will be completed in the next 12 month will cost Kshs. 115 million and is projected to supply 750 m^3 of fresh water per day. Currently, the University needs 225m^3 of water per day but has access to only 160 m^3

 ${\rm m}^3$ having to allocate resources to meet the deficit. The water reservoir will be 11 meters deep and 320 meters in length covering a total of 5 hectares on the West end of the Athi River campus.

Speaking on behalf of the facilitators, the ICT Manager Mr. Solomon Mburu called on the young people to use technology ethically. "The little knowledge that you have can cause havoc," he cautioned.

DLPDI Director Prof. Abraham Waithima, thanked the young people for staying the course, the facilitators

for making the progamme a success and parents for paying the fees for their sons and daughters to attend the training. He said the aim of the training was to equip the school leavers with skills to make informed decisions with regard to career choices, provide a forum to engage with professionals, opportunity for networking as well as learn skills to help them with problem solving and decision making, and ICT competency among other topics. Prof. Waithima further revealed that the Institute was in the process of designing Graphic Design and 3D Animation as well as Young Entrepreneurs programmes that will empower the young people on entrepreneurial skills.

He also revealed that the Institute will soon roll out three diplomas: Human Resource, Business Administration and Management and ICT, and encouraged the school leavers to apply.

Other speakers were Mr. Willie Mwangi and Mrs. Jane Mutua, representing the facilitators and parents respectively.
